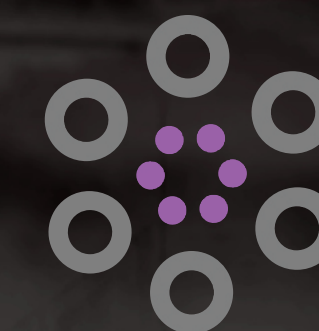

Why monitoring matters...

Rates of abuse of older people are high in institutions such as nursing homes with 2 in 3 staff members reporting they have committed abuse in the past year.

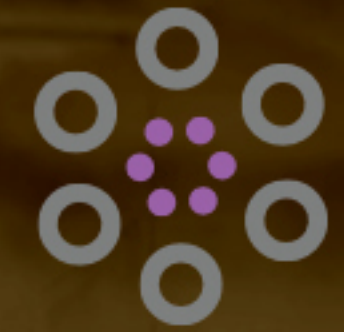
Why monitoring matters...

Rates of Abuse in Nursing Homes and Long-Term Care Facilities:

Physical + Sexual Abuse
By Employee = 36%

Physical + Sexual Abuse
By Another Resident = 22%
